MISSION REPORT

SOUTH SUDAN 2025

Juba Overview

Juba is the capital city of South Sudan and the seat of power for the nation. It lies in the southern part of South Sudan and is bordered by both Uganda and DR Congo.

Typically dry, Juba offers lush vegetation around its riverine areas with low hills and savannahs in abundance all around.

As the capital of the nation, it also has a diverse cast of tribes living within it with the Bari people understood to be the native population of the land. While English is the official language, there are many people who are more comfortable with the local Arabic language sometimes referred to as 'Juba Arabic.'



Background Information

Our first trip to South Sudan was in July 2024, where we spent about 8 days. It was a packed week and the primary focus of that visit was to meet and fellowship with the people and to identify core areas of needs. It was during this trip that Biblical Education was revealed as a clear gap and we began making plans to return to meet the needs of the people.



Mission Summary

It was a 28-day short-term mission trip that kicked off on the 5th of September, 2025. Our primary goals for this second visit were to start off a theological and bible training institute in Juba, South Sudan, to fellowship with the churches, and to partner with pastors and other spiritual leaders for the advancement of the gospel in the nation.

We launched the *Missions And Theological Training Institute (MATTI)* on Saturday, 13th September, 2025 with an Inaugural Lecture & Commencement Ceremony at the Mountain of God Church in Juba, pastored by the National Director for Club 2000 Mission International in South Sudan, Pastor Matthew Rabbi.

Classes began on Sunday, 14th of September, 2025 as we began teaching a foundational series covering topics such as *Faith, The Bible, Prayer, The New Birth, and a few others*. The classes were open to all and free of charge; following a weekend meeting structure. During this time, we were able to properly engage with the people of Juba to understand their needs and areas where understanding was lacking.

More importantly, the opportunity to fellowship with different churches on Sunday mornings was a great blessing to us and provided more insight into the culture and practices of the body of Christ there.

Prior to the start of the classes, we had a meeting with four of the Bishops living and serving in Juba, and they were happy to partner with us and participate in the training as well. These bishops preside over a network of churches and are able representatives of the Evangelical and Pentecostal bodies in the nation. We were glad to have their hand of fellowship and grateful for the partnerships that were formed.

On the 27th of September, we had a short assessment to test their understanding of the subjects covered, which were written in both English and Arabic, and the next day, all those who passed received a certificate of participation as part of a closing ceremony and mini-seminar to mark the end of this phase of the training program. The rest of our time in Juba was spent preparing for our return to Nigeria as well as laying the foundations for our return trip in 2026, where the launch of the Diploma Program will begin. There were also talks of *Vocational Development* and *English* courses, which we plan to incorporate in our next visit.
